Agenda Items/Notes

1. Co-Presidents' Report

- i. Introductions
 - All attending members knew each other; introductions were waved
- ii. Membership Update
 - Currently 124 members, the goal is to reach 140 by November

 - Margaret mentioned the RJH membership might be low due to lack of opportunity of afterschool programs already ran
 - Work of the PTA tends to be geared towards the elementary school however most grants go for middle school....becomes transactional

v. Assembly ideas

- PTA investigated Kindness and Diversity assembly ideas at the request of Suzanne Lull
- Budgeted \$6500 each school (already spent \$2000 RJH and \$1100 RES)
- Option 1: Accept the Challenge Mass. Down Syndrome
 - Goal to promote understanding and acceptance of each other regardless of differences Interactive group assembly – another educator saw this and said it was impactful
 - \$1000 for 45 min assembly
- Option 2: Tiger Program Theater, Integrating Guidance, Education, and Responsibility
 - Prof. theatre company from Plymouth State
 - \$825 for 1 or \$1550 for both schools
 - RJH: Bystander: A Portrait of Empathy a Jr. High Musical type performance designed to initiate change, to take ownership of their schools climate and eliminate the things in their social lives at school that scare them most.
 - RES: I've got your back raising awareness to bullying behavior by empowering bystanders to help stop the behavior; OR Just Between Friends what it takes to make and be good friends
 - Could also look across the district to see if other schools would be interested and reduce cost
- Option 3: Johnny the K Geared more for Elementary School, promotes messages of environmental conservation, cultural diversity, positive behavior and self-esteem thru music, props and audience participation
 - Jacquie saw him and said he was wonderful
- Alternative Option Suggested by Katie Jones: Houston Craft Character Strong for RJH
 - She will get more information

2. Vice President's Report

- i. Grant requests and vote
 - Moth StoryTelling revisited from last meeting
 - Competition will be held at RJH Hold auditions (audition workshop)
 - Teachers work in teams; Jeffrey will hold workshops Condense timing 6 weeks
 - Performance in Spring (March 15th) when Moth comes to Music Hall
 - Looking for community volunteers (i.e. Minnie White Poet Warrior of NH)
 - Students could develop an app to vote Sheila will look into it
 - People who weren't chosen will be able to participate via future podcasts or other venues
 - RJH Podcasts weekly pod cast link to podcast of the moth
 - Night performance and day performance; looking to bus the 5th graders to RJH
