1. Co-Presidents' Report

i. Events for 2018-2019

- Possible Bake Sales on Dec. 4th (1 and 2) and 11th (3 − 5th) at the Holiday Concerts
- Staff Cookie Swap Monday, Dec 10th
 - Cookie Swap volunteer needed
 - Kierstie to set up sign up
- UNH Hockey Outting 1/12th (Social Event)
 - Plan to offer ticket at Face value as a fun night out and not to fundraise
 - \$9 or \$15 depending on seat location
- Someone Special Snowball February 2nd
 - Some parents are disappointed that they took away gender specific events like the Father/Daughter dance and Mother Son Bowling
 - Overall consensus of PTA board is that we want people to feel good about their options and be an inclusive community
 - It's challenging to have everything be suitable to everyone
 - We are open to other opinions
 - Question was brought up as to whether we can offer another event that isn't a dance
 - Kim Piela to check with Laura Hancock about chairing a bowling event
 - Looking for someone to chair the dance: Jeannette Lindsay chaired it last year and has a binder of information to share
 - Katie Cerasoli will volunteer to chair the dance
- Family Game Night
 - Idea is to plan an evening during the winter as part of Wellness Week
 - Event will be held at RES with appropriate age levels
 - ASE could maybe make life-size games to support the effort
- Bike Parade
 - This will be a community event
 - Continued discussions for planning the event and ideas:
 - Will reach out to people to see if there is interest: Police, Fire, Library
 - Contest for best decorated
 - Bike Safety incorporated
 - Bike Swap
 - Parsons field
 - Will reach out to selectman after getting other feedback
- Movie Night
 - Not going to hold parent movie night for as we did last year with Polar Express
 - Time of Year around first week in December was hard

- Polar Express event was used to fill in to the holiday concerts which was cancelled last year only
- If holding additional movie nights, some things to consider:
 - Would need additional staff, microphone, strong adult presence

ii. Playground update

- Parents expressed disappointment in the playground equipment would go to RJH
- Looked to add GAGA pit (brand bake sale profits as "Playground GaGa pit fund

iii. Speakers and Assemblies

- There is considerable budget allotted for Speakers and Assemblies
- Still looking for ideas such as Positivity, Body image, Attitude/Bossiness Focus on Kindness, Self Confidence, etc.

iv. ASE

- Signups will begin Monday, November 12th
- Discussion around offerings at RJH; difficult to run as students are involved in other activities/clubs
- Looking for idea that kids would be interested in; currently haven't gotten traction
- · Art club currently at RJH but not tied to ASE
- Consider branding it a little differently Give budget to have clubs vs. an activity every week
- Possibly check with Mr. Ross about running something for 5th grade

2. Vice President's Report

- i. Membership
 - 141 members
 - Tracking similar to last year

ii. Grants

- No new grants
- Grant submissions are due 1 week before an upcoming PTA meeting
- RJH is requesting money for Open House to have Pizza supplied
- Follow-up on last month's grants:
 - Purchase birdseed to continue bird study in elementary school
 - Natures outpost donated one bag
 - Rachel to investigate other options
 - Needs approx. 100 lbs.
 - Purchase for multi-use organizers with baskets needed for math center (Maggie Hanna)
 - Organizer additional funds approved
- Additional barrels and liners for Composting (Suzanne Lull)
 - The ask was for an additional \$843 (2 extra bins \$568 and \$275 for liners = \$843
 - Mr. Fox is currently supplying 1x a week
 - We are using more liners than expected thus the reason for needing to purchase extra
 - This is included in budget for next year (school board)
 - Unassigned fund balance kicks in at March
 - Budget goes by category not classroom and doesn't go by grade level
 - Needs buy-in at RJH; Help middle school do more recycling programs, etc.; some community members are willing to help
 - They have composting trays at RJH but unsure if they are getting over to RES
 - System needs to be put in place at RJH
 - Joan Provencher can be a community member

- Question on if schools have considered plastic forks/spoon
 - ❖ Rachel will look into it more for compostable silverware
 - Investment in terms of a commercial dishwasher (thousands of dollars and needs to have a lot of space for drying)
 - ❖ Worth considering but would need to be researched thoroughly
- Voting In regards to the \$843: Brigitte 1st, Tasha 2nd, all in favor, none opposed

3. Treasurer's Report

I. Budget Report

- Current balance and outstanding checks discussed
- PTA Sponsorship fund allocation
 - Moved \$6750 to the school play budget based on original idea that RJH was going to have 2 productions which then increased the sponsorship funds to \$12500 per Nina's request
 - RJH can't find a director for the 2nd play
 - Decreasing the amount of sponsorship to \$10K
 - Budget for Jeffrey is paid from School Board
 - Assistant Director is paid from PTA
 - Christine Sedam looking to put on a small play at elementary school
 - Estimating \$3K for expenses (\$2200 to Adelle)
 - Question as to whether or not this can be an ASE program
 - 5. Tasha/Julie reaching out
 - REF was wondering if there could be a fee associated to offset the production cost
 - ❖ For 4th and 5th grade students
 - ❖ A large amount of kids were interested and they are trying to open more spots than last year
 - Students could be chosen by a lottery system (unless they have funds for another staff person)
 - Connecting with Tasha to see what they need in terms of budget
 - The planning and preparation would be approx. 8 or 10 weeks (similar to ASE)
 - Nina Parrott was working on Long Story Short
 - Looking to do it at the 3SArt Space on April 11th
 - Voting on reallocating funds: Rachel 1st, Kerry 2nd, all in favor, none opposed
- Budget income
 - Goal is to have everything be gross
 - ASE doesn't prorate
 - Some checks are late but charged a late fee
 - Some students could have scholarships
 - Brigitte is working to figure out a way for the numbers/income to show correctly
