2. Vice Presidents' Report

- Grants
 - None submitted this month
 - Update on Theatre Grant

 - Following up with Suzanne
 - Looking at numbers and if we can hire another person to help to increase enrollment
 - UNH internship opportunity

 - Would run concurrently to see how the enrollment plays out
 - Could change description to make it more appealing to both girls and boys maybe about music vs. robot or sports
